### Manager's comment

In June 2016 we earned 0.8 % beating our benchmark, the Russell 2000 by 1 %. This brings our return and alpha for the year to 4.6 % and 3.2 %, respectively, and the alpha since inception of the fund to 31.5 %. Our volatility (20%) and beta (1.0) remain at approximately the same level as our benchmark.

The month started off well but then Brexit spoiled the good atmosphere, at least until investors started reconsidering the theory that Brexit would create a worldwide recession.

During the month we sold three stocks because of takeovers: Patriot National, American Science and Engineering and Westport Fuel Systems. We bought Tower International, CalAmp, National Grocers by Vitamin and ShoreTel.

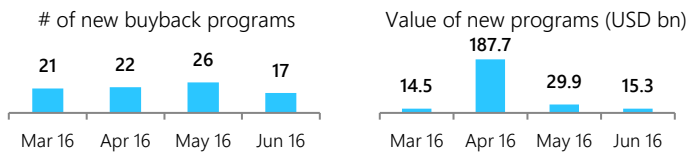
### Fund strategy

The PV Buyback USA Fund, launched in June 2011, is a long-only fund focused on small and mid caps listed on the US equity market.

It invests in companies announcing share buyback programs to take advantage of an undervalued stock price. To identify those firms where the repurchase is most likely motivated by undervaluation, the Fund has developed a systematic approach.

Fund managers are highly experienced and have a strong track record in developing and implementing this investment strategy.

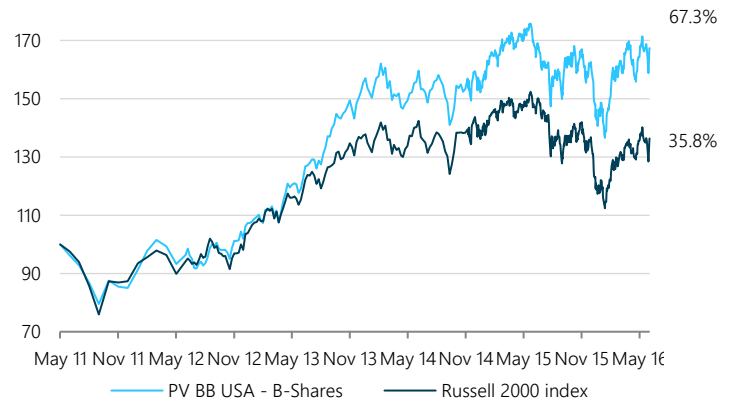
